

ICMM 2026 Abstract Submission Guidelines

Thank you for your interest in presenting at the 46th ICMM World Congress of Military Medicine, Abu Dhabi 2026. To ensure your abstract receives full consideration, please review and adhere to the following guidelines.

Abstract submissions are welcome from professionals, researchers, faculty, and students across all relevant fields. Please submit only original work that has not been previously published or presented elsewhere.

Please read and follow the guidelines below to assist you with your abstract submission.

Writing Style, Content and Formatting

Word Limit:

- Abstracts must be between 250 and 300 words, excluding the title and author information.

Language & Style:

- Use clear, precise, and formal scientific English.
- Submit abstracts in English or French.
- Maintain an objective tone; avoid personal opinions.
- Define all abbreviations at first mention and avoid unexplained jargon.

Formatting:

- Follow a structured format, typically with separate sections for Introduction, Methods, Results, and Conclusion.
- Font and Spacing: Use a standard font like Times New Roman or Arial, 12-point size,

Structure:

- Title:** The paper's title should be brief and informative, not exceeding 20 words.
- Introduction/Background:** Provide a concise statement of the study's context and purpose.
- Methods:** Summarize the key methodological approaches and study design.
- Results:** Present the primary findings with clear data; avoid vague statements.
- Conclusions:** Highlight the study's impact, novelty, or implications.
- Keywords:** Provide 3–5 relevant keywords, separated by commas (not included in the word count).

Abstract Submission Formats:

Oral Presentation

A spoken presentation delivered by the author during a scheduled scientific session. Oral presentations are 12 minutes long, followed by a short Q&A.

Poster Presentation

A visual display of research or project findings presented on a printed or digital poster. Authors summarize their work using concise text, figures, and tables.

Workshop Session

An interactive educational session designed to promote hands-on learning, group discussion, or skill development on a specific topic. It may include practical exercises, case studies, or small-group activities led by expert facilitators.

Skill Transfer Session

A Skill Transfer Session (STS) is a hands-on, instructor-led session designed to transfer a specific, practical medical skill from an expert to participants. Unlike workshops (which emphasize discussion or scenario planning), STS sessions focus on performing and mastering procedures, often using mannequins, simulators, anatomical models, or field equipment.

Focus Group Discussion

A Focus Group Discussion (FGD) is a moderated, interactive session centered on a specific topic or area of interest, bringing together participants who share expertise or curiosity in that field. Each session runs for 1.5 hours and typically includes brief 12-minute presentations followed by guided group discussion to exchange perspectives, identify challenges, and generate collaborative insights or recommendations.

Submission:

- All materials intended for presentation at the 46th ICMM World Congress of Military Medicine, Abu Dhabi 2026 must be submitted via the designated abstract submission portal. Abstract Submission Link: <Https://icmm-congress-2026.portal.lineup.ninja/>
- All mandatory fields in the submission form must be completed before the abstract can be considered.
- An author may submit no more than two abstracts

Acceptance Notification for Oral and Poster Presenters:

- Email notification of abstract acceptance will be sent to the primary author only.
- The primary author must respond by either accepting or declining the invitation to present the abstract by the specified acceptance deadline.
- Once accepted, the conference secretariat will contact you to request all documents required to process your participation as a presenter or speaker.
- Authors presenting abstracts must be registered participants; acceptance of an abstract does not grant free registration.
